


⁸ Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. ¹⁰ Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. ¹¹ For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" (Luke 2:8-14)

From the outside, Diana Alfonso appears to be a young woman who is experiencing all the blessings of our loving God and in fact, she is. She is beautiful and talented. She has a wonderful husband and lovely children. She lives in a beautiful house and drives a nice car. But it wasn't always that way. Diana will tell you, "People need to know where I've come from. God has brought me so far. There is a reason why I worship my Lord."

For Diana, it all began in the projects of Newark, New Jersey. She was the middle child of five children. She grew up without a father and life was tough. As a child she witnessed alcoholism and domestic violence. At times, she also experienced it. Due to difficulties at home, she lived with an aunt for a while and was sent to Puerto Rico to live for a year. At thirteen years of age, she accepted Jesus as her Lord. A cousin and her mother came to visit and she was introduced to the Lord and began attending a Pentecostal church. Diana remembers, "It was my first love. I was after Jesus."

At age 15, she left home. Her life was unstable as she found refuge first in one person's house and then in another and another. As a teenager, Di-

ana was angry, rebellious and lonely. She admits

drifting away from the church and at 19, she learned she was pregnant. "I was almost five months pregnant and didn't realize it. I didn't know what was happening to my body." After the baby was born, she was confused and prayed to God for guidance. "I was just lost. I knew I had God, but there I was in my car with a baby and a bag of clothes with nowhere to go." The Lord put a church member in her life, a woman with a daycare in her home, who volunteered to take care of the baby while Diana looked for jobs. A cousin took her in and Diana began to make a life for herself and her child as the Lord provided jobs and opportunities to help her.

One day as she and a girlfriend were traveling the Garden State Parkway on their way to the Jersey shore, a car with two handsome young men pulled alongside them. After a bit of flirting, the boys asked'" What exit are you getting off?" The answer was "137!" The couples met at the McDonald's and that was the start of a relationship for Diana and Lazaro. They dated, fell in love, and married on April 11, 1999. They have 5 children, Jonathan, Crystal, Keana, Lazaro, and Isabella.

Although she was attending church, Diana was not satisfied. She couldn't wear makeup or slacks and felt she had a gift she was unable to share so she

Diana says of herself, "God created me to worship. I'm a worshipper." Diana's advice to young women: "Get into the

In May of this year, we held a two-day youth rally which I considered very benefi-





During this joyous Christmas season, we celebrate the greatest gift ever presented to us and that gift is the birth of Jesus Christ. God loves us so much that His only son, Jesus Christ, was born as a sacrificial lamb for our sins. God Himself provided the only acceptable sacrifice, Jesus, who could atone for the sins of His people. God's perfect Son, Jesus, fulfilled God's perfect law to bring us back to God.

"He made Christ who knew no sin to [judicially] be sin on our behalf, so that in Him we would become the righteousness of God [that is, we would be made acceptable to Him and placed in a right relationship with Him by His gracious lovingkindness].

2 Corinthians 5:21

Jesus was born and died for our sins so that we no longer have to live a life of sin. Through Je-

sus we have the opportunity to restore our relationship with God. We can live a life of prosperity and peace, with the understanding that God supplies all our needs; our peace and prosperity is all wrapped up in His word, *Shalom*. For as the heavens are high above the earth, So great is His lovingkindness toward those who fear and worship Him [with awe-filled respect and deepest reverence]. As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us. Just as a father loves his children, So the LORD loves those who fear and worship Him [with awe-filled respect and deepest reverence]."

The benefits of renewal:

"Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" But when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus."

Luke 1:28b-31 NKJ

As wonderful as this sounds, for Mary it would cause shame and embarrassment to herself, her family, and her betrothed, Joseph. According to the Law of Moses, she could be stoned to death. Mary and Joseph were children of Israel from the royal line of David. They understood and followed Old Testament law. Deuteronomy 22:13-30 explains the laws of sexual morality. It clearly states that a young woman must be a

virgin when she weds. "But if the thing is true, and evidences of virginity are not found for the young woman, then they shall bring out the young woman to the door of her father's house, and the men of her city shall stone her to death with stones, because she has done a disgraceful thing in Israel..." (Deuteronomy 22:20, 21).

One could only imagine the

days before the wedding for the bride. The excitement of planning and knowing her future is set. The marriage was most likely arranged (as was the custom), she may have fallen in love with Joseph years before, and now she was finally getting married. The angel said she was highly favored, blessed among women. It, therefore, had to be evident to everyone, that Joseph had an exceptional woman...one could even say virtuous.

What would make her highly favored? She most likely grew up hearing the stories of old. She had to reverence God, knew Him to be the Great I Am. "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him" (2 Chronicles 16:9). Clearly, His eyes had been upon her. She had to be wor-

thy of such an assignment, but the Bible tells us initially she was troubled: "But when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was" (Luke 1:29). The Greek meaning of this troubled is to disturb wholly, i.e. agitate (with alarm). The Amplified Bible says, "...she was greatly troubled and disturbed and confused at what he said and kept revolving in her mind



what such a greeting might mean." In an instant, her plans, her dreams must have flashed through her Maybe she head. thought, why is this happening now? What does this mean for me and my life with Joseph?

Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.

And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name JESUS. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end." Luke 1:30-33

Mary had to know what the prophets had spoken of the birth of the Messiah. "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14). She asked, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. Now indeed, Elizabeth your relative has also conceived a son in her old age; and this is now the



sixth month for her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible" (Luke 1:34 -37).

The fullness of this angelic visit culminates with that last line... "For with God nothing will be impossible." All of her fleshly thoughts... confusion and fear, disappear. Her fo-

cus shifts from herself to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The Lord God, the Great I Am, will handle everything; she only needs to obey. She relinquishes her concern for her reputation, her wedding, her betrothed, and her family. She says, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38a).

Mary surrendered her will for His will, trusting Him and believing everything would be all right. He had a purpose and plan for her, but she had to humble herself to the point of obedience. This is the heart of a servant...

"Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you." 1 Peter 5:6, 7

Do not be afraid I bring you tidings of great joy which will be to all people. Luke 2:10.



The Bible teaches that we are justified by the grace of God (Romans 3:24; Titus 3:7). Justified means declared not guilty. When we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior, all charges against us are dropped and we are free from sin. When God forgives our sins, the record is wiped clean. It is as if we had never sinned.

A preacher once explained grace with this acronym:


God's - Riches - At - Christ's - Expense PRAY THIS PRAYER OUT LOUD:


If you've prayed this prayer of salvation with true conviction, you are now a follower of Jesus.
