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
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But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. (Matthew 6:33)

It's imperative that we as believers understand the necessity in putting the word of God first in our lives. We live in a natural world that seems to demand that we do things that make sense, but I want to let you know that faith does not make sense to the natural mind, for in first Corinthians 2:14 the Bible says, "But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." When Jesus says, "seek first the kingdom of God", then you must consider exactly what He says. Faith begins where the will of God is known. We must not consider what makes sense, but only what the word of God is saying.

In my vast experience with people, many are operating in the natural trying to establish themselves; however, God did not instruct us to establish ourselves but to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and ALL THESE THINGS SHALL BE ADDED TO YOU". God wants us to believe His word and act on His word by doing what it says. God not only will establish you but He will make the devil back off while He does it (read II Thessalonians 3:3).

James in his writings provides an amazing revelation along these lines, "But be doers of

the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the word, this one will be blessed in what he does. (James 1:22-25). The key to being a doer of the word is revealed in this text: you must faithfully CONTINUE in it. Make hearing the word of God a way of life for you. Proverbs chapter 4 verses 21-22, "My son, give attention to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. Do not let them depart from your eyes; keep them in the midst of your heart; for they are life to those who find them, and health to all their flesh."

Allow me if you will to share a bit of my own testimony. When I was called into public

ministry, it was my heart's desire to do the will of God. I had no ulterior motives. I did not know that faithfulness would be rewarded here on earth the way that it has been. I just simply gave myself constantly to the word of God and prayer, doing whatever good thing my hands found to do. As a result, God has added many things to me. I am a living witness that when you put first things first, that all these things will be added. I remind people from time to time about the pitfall of making THINGS their priority. Get it right; SEEK FIRST JESUS. When we get our priorities right all else will work fine. Psalm 37:3-5 "Trust in the Lord, and do good; dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness. Delight yourself also in the Lord, and He shall give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord, trust also in Him, and He shall bring it to pass."



Member Spotlight

Harold LaMarr, Sr. was born in Florida where at age six, he was baptized in the lake, but he grew up in New Jersey. When he was nine years old, he moved to Newark where he attended school. He later attended cake decorating school in Detroit with the goal of becoming a baker's assistant. When that didn't work out, he attended Essex County Technical School and trained in the repair of air conditioners, refrigerators, televisions, and other electronics. He spent the next thirty years in the retail business. Initially, he owned a furniture store which he sold to establish LaMarr's Appliance Center in Newark. "I've always been business minded. I remember once I had a vision of myself in business. I looked out the window and saw a van with my name on it." That vision became a reality in 1963 as a Volkswagen van with LaMarr's Appliance on the side. In 1971, he established H. LaMarr Service, Incorporated in Plainfield, New Jersey, which was in business for twenty-two years.

At a party, he met Gloria Burks who later became his wife and business partner. "Gloria did the books and did the selling. I made the service calls. People claimed we would never survive in business together but we did and were very successful." A son was born to the couple, followed by three daughters. Harold recalls, "We had an excellent family life. Our home in Plainfield was the gathering place for all the cookouts and holidays." On April 3, Harold and Gloria will celebrate 61 years of marriage. They presently have three grandchildren and three great grandchildren with another one on the way.

When thinking about retirement, Harold began looking in Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Delaware for a house. His daughter gave him some information on Crestwood Village in Whiting, New Jersey. "When we saw the house, we knew it was just what we were looking for." They moved in 2004. Harold began attending the Wednesday morning Bible Study at Harmony while attending another church. He came out to support a car wash to raise funds for the Harmony youth and met Darryl Lee who invited him to a Men's Fellowship meeting. It wasn't long before he and Gloria became regulars at Sunday service and joined Harmony Ministries. When asked why he keeps coming to Harmony, Harold responded, "Because I'm a member. My main concern is my spiritual life. I appreciate the teaching ministry and I love the people."

Although he grew up in the church, it wasn't until later that Harold began an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. He remembers sitting in a hotel room and realizing that his life had to change. He was asking himself, where do I go from here? He found a Gideon Bible in the room and began to flip through it. "For



every question I had, my hand would find a verse that answered it. That morning I met Jesus for myself and I knew He was real. When I got saved, I was in my mid -thirties, married with a family. After my experience with the Lord, I felt I was the same physically, mentally, and emotionally, but everything about me was enhanced. I was a better man, a better husband, a better father, a better brother. Other people recognized the change in me. Jesus made me better at what I am and He is still doing it." A few weeks later when a man spoke about the Gideons at his church, Harold, wanting to know more about the group, gave him his contact information. "This led to my being invited to their Christmas party and giving my testimony about what their ministry had done for me."

Harold has always been a people person. "I love people, I love being around people, I love helping people." He demonstrates this love by driving for Somebody Cares, a volunteer organization of Crestwood Village in Whiting. "We drive seniors to doctor's appointments or take them shopping. We even have a handicap van so we can help seniors in wheelchairs." At 6 a.m., Monday through Friday, Harold LaMarr can found on his knees at Harmony Ministries' morning prayer. He is also a regular at Wednesday morning Bible Study and the monthly Men's Fellowship meeting. On Sunday morning, he will greet you with a smile and a hug as he serves as an usher at Harmony Ministries. One of Harold LaMarr's favorite Bible verses is Micah 6:8, "He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?" When asked why that verse has particular significance, Harold replied, "That verse identifies me." Harold LaMarr, Senior: a businessman, a family man, a people person, a man of God.

Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. 2 Timothy 4:2

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Thessalonians 5:16-18

Just want to praise You, forever and ever for all You've done for me. Blessing and glory and honor, they all belong to You. Thank you Jesus for blessing me! Let the words and melody of this song resonate through your mind and heart. This is one of my favorite praise and worship songs and there are many, but worship has more to do with the heart of the believer than the singing or even the songs we sing.

Psalm 100:1-3 NKJ tells us, "Make a joyful shout to the Lord, all you lands! Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing. Know that the Lord, He is God. It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves. We are His people and the sheep of His pasture." The Hebrew translation of singing in this text refers back to joyful shout in verse 1, and it means to emit a stridulous sound, or make a shrill creaking sound. In this text, it is a shout or a cry out in joy; it is a joyful voice, singing or triumphing. It is not limited to musical singing. This scripture suggests we have cause to shout joyfully in whatever oral expression because of who God is. This idea is supported in the entire passage, Psalm 100:1-5 NKJ, as it gives the believer reasons to praise the Lord: He is God. He made us. We are His people.

Psalm 100:5 goes on to say, For the Lord is good; His mercy is everlasting, and His truth endures to all generations." Therefore, verse 4 says we should "enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name. This joyful shout or singing is the result of the fullness of God in our lives. Too often, the emphasis of praise and worship is on this outward public expression. When we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior and we are fully persuaded that the word of God is truth, we make a melody in our hearts, honoring God daily even when there is no music or crowd.

John 4:23, 24 NKJ tells us, But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth. The Greek translation for worship in this passage of scripture is to fawn or crouch; to prostrate oneself in homage or reverence. Fawn means to seek favor by servile flattery or exaggerated attention. The inference here is the state of mind and/or heart of the worshiper. It says nothing about singing or shouting, and the scripture says the "Father"

is seeking such to worship Him."

Colossians 3:16 tells us to admonish one another in songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord and while I personally love to sing songs of praise and worship to the Lord, this passage of scripture implies more than what we see during a church service. In fact, while the Greek translation for singing in this text does mean to sing, a closer look at the text in its entirety infers that this should be a way of life for the believer. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and

leave that physical place, you will have an attitude of praise and worship all the time. Philippians 4:8 NKJ tells us to meditate on whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy...; we are to think deeply and deliberately about these things. We also know that as a man thinks in his heart, so is he (Proverbs 4:23). Such a believer is thankful and grateful and is one for whom worship is a choice, not just in song on Sunday, but in word and



hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. Colossians 3:16, 17.

During the worship service, the worshiper has learned to focus solely on the Lord. Worshipers discipline their minds and do not allow the enemy to keep them from worship. Having entered that place of worship fosters an unquenchable desire to stay there. It is there that you find peace and joy. It is there that the truth of God's word becomes real to you. Praise and worship changes your attitude because it keeps your mind and thoughts on God. So, even though you may

deed. This believer desires to please God by continually offering the sacrifice of praise, that is the fruit of his or her lips, giving thanks, and doing good so God will be well pleased (Hebrews 13:15).

Such an attitude of praise and worship keeps the mind disciplined and does not allow the enemy to get the believer off track. That old song says, when the praises go up, the blessings come down. I Thessalonians 5:15-18 NKJ tells us, See that no one renders evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good both for yourselves and for all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Proverbs 14:30 (ESV) A tranquil heart gives life to the flesh, but envy makes the bones rot.

The human heart is an incredibly powerful and vital organ which works constantly without ever pausing to rest, and therefore, it is essential that we alleviate additional stress on our ever working cardiac muscles.

Adhering to some basic rules such as eating a healthy diet, regular exercise, and getting adequate rest can help to ensure the ability of cardiac muscles to function at their utmost capacity.

How much you eat is just as important as what you eat, and controlling portion size is essential. Vegetables and fruits are wise food choices because they contain substances found in plants that may help to prevent cardiovascular disease and also help you to eat less high-fat foods, such as meat, cheese and snack foods. Likewise, limiting the quantity of unhealthy fats you eat, such as saturated and trans fats, as well as including whole grains in your diet, are also vital steps to reduce your blood cholesterol and lower your risk of coronary artery disease. I would encourage everyone to make a habit of reading food labels to help you discern what you are eating.

Regular exercise helps to control and maintain our weight at healthy levels, and is critically important to strengthening our hearts.

While these factors help to avoid additional stress of our ever working heart muscles, it is without question that peace in of mind is one of the major components in maintaining a healthy and tranquil heart.

Having a tranquil heart is achieved as we place our trust totally in God. The Lord knows that when we allow him to be our Shepherd we can have peace. We can elevate our minds above the cares and concerns of daily life and steal away in His peace. The Bible declares, "the Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the pres-

ence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows" (PSALM 23 1-5). How comforting to know that our Father, the all-knowing and loving God is leading us. Our Father longs for us to trust him. He encourages us to come closer to His arm and rest in him. He said, "I have set the Lord always before me; because He is at my right hand, I shall not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad and my glories rejoice. My flesh will rest in hope" (PSALM 16: 8-9).

He is the Prince of Peace; Jesus frees us from whatever the burden we are carrying that may be weighing us down, and creating a heavy yoke on our hearts. Our relationship with God will transform meaningless worry into spiritual purpose and productivity. "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you, but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God?" Micah 6:8

When I received the topic of my assignment for this article I was baffled because I couldn't see the connection between the Great Commission and the scriptural reference I was given. The scriptures that I associated with this call of God on every born again believer were Matthew 28:18-20 or Mark 16:15-20. Therefore, I went before the Lord in prayer and asked the Holy Spirit to give me greater understanding and insight to what God wanted revealed in this article that I wasn't seeing, and I was led to look up the word "commission." In my 1964 Webster 7th Collegiate Dictionary I found the following definition:

Commission- an authorization or command to act in a prescribed manner or to perform prescribed acts; a charge; an authority to act for in behalf of or in place of another; a task or matter entrusted to one as an agent for another.

We have been authorized by Jesus to bring others into the Kingdom of God, and it was revealed to me that Micah 6:8 has *everything* to do with the Great Commission; these are our marching orders. We are to live a life of integrity, loving mercy (or being compassionate toward others, and then walking humbly before God) never forgetting that without Him we are nothing; always acknowledging Him as the source of everything good in our lives.

That is our holy calling that draws others to us, so we can tell them about Jesus and all that He has done.

God is good and kind, and He does good as it says in Psalms 119:68 (AMPC), yet there are so many people that don't know that God wants them to have a good life, and it is our responsibility as believers to tell everyone we can about the love of God. 

Now the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace. James 3:18 (NKJV)

This is the season of peace, renewed hope, joy and thanksgiving. Unfortunately, some people suffering from depression are unable to feel the peace that the season brings. This is certainly not what the Lord wants for His people and He gives us ways to combat it and bring His peace into our hearts.

Firstly, it is important to recognize there are several types of depression, and some people may require medication to help lift them enough to be able to allow God to work in their hearts and minds. Therefore, if you are suffering from a clinical type of depression, please, seek appropriate medical help — remember that God gave the doctors their skills and abilities too.

Our God is a tender and loving God and He will not force Himself on us. We have been given free will and it is up to us to welcome Him into our hearts and minds, and build us up to be used in His divine plan. This article is a Biblical approach to overcoming depression and is *not* intended to be a medical solution or direction.

As we have heard, and come to know, God provides for all of our needs in His time and according to His plan for each of us; Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you (1 Peter 5:6 NKJV). It is important for us to recognize that there is a plan, and the Lord has given us direction when it comes to our thoughts and how to control them. "...whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy – meditate on

these things" (Philippians 4:8 NKJV). The Lord directs us to deliberately think on good things; this is especially important when our thoughts turn to the negative and morose. We control what thoughts we will entertain and give a place in our minds.

The enemy constantly tries to put negative thoughts into our heads in his attempts to accuse us and turn us from the one true God and rob us of our peace. We know that salvation comes through Christ and in Him we have justification from our sins. God sent His only begotten Son, Jesus, to pay the price for our sins and if we accept Him and invite Him in, He will abide in our hearts and do great things. Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me (Revelation 3:20). What could be better to fill us with joy and peace than having the Lord of all inside our hearts?

In her book, Battlefield of the Mind, Joyce Meyers writes about "Wilderness Mentalities," which she describes as a mindset of complaining, bemoaning and failing to take hold of what God says to us, causing us to wander around in circles of despair, going nowhere. Of particular note is the mentality #8 which says, "I don't deserve God's blessings because I am not worthy." Moses sent twelve spies into the Land of Canaan to scope out the situation there. As we know, ten of them came back with disheartened reports reflecting a lower opinion of themselves and what God was capable of doing. How depressing! We, like the ten spies, often allow ourselves to be stripped of peace. We often feel we are not worthy of peace, though nothing could be further from the truth!

This is not new because there are many episodes of depression revealed in both the Old and New Testaments, as well as many verses of instruction on dealing with depression, God's way! David had bouts of depression. He wrote songs about it, recorded in the Psalms, where he cried out to the Lord to deliver him from the desperation he was facing. But God! Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy(1 Peter 4:12,13 NKJV).

The whole point of what Jesus endured for our benefit was so we didn't have to go through the pain and suffering that was rightfully ours. The Lord took all of our pain, all of our sickness, all of our desperation. He wants peace for His children and for us to be His ambassadors to the people of all nations. It would not make sense for anyone to want to be a follower of Christ if His ambassadors are glum and unhappy! "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you. Yes, I will help you. I will uphold you with My righteous right hand (Isaiah 41:10 (NKJV). God will not leave you. He will be there even when it doesn't feel

like it. "When you cannot see God's hand, trust His heart" (Anonymous).

Peace does not necessarily come to us without effort, and if all we had to do was just go about our lives singing sunshine and roses and bluebirds of happiness, we would not recognize peace for the blessing it is. Whoever desires to love life and see good days, let him keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit; (1 Peter 3:10 ESV).

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Our Lord this season, let us all take time to reflect and meditate on the blessings that the Lord has provided for us, and to share with one another the joy the Lord has made possible by His death, burial, and Resurrection, for without this, there would be no hope, no joy, no peace. For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called, Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace(Isaiah 9:6 NKJV).

clarity. Knowing this humbles me and fills me with thankfulness to and for my Savior.

This Christmas season I pray that you give yourself the gift of embracing your very limitlessness in Christ. Be joyful, coming together with loved ones to bask in the blessings that Jesus has bestowed upon us; reflecting upon His saving grace and the tender mercies of our Lord; the power and authority that He has given to us to rule over all things in this earth; and the loving kindness that He pours down upon us daily.

2 Timothy 1:6 For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, 7 for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and selfcontrol.


