



Kevin Mosely

Mr. Kevin Mosely has always known that the hand of God was upon his life. After graduating from Brooklyn Technical High School, he went to the United States Naval Academy. "It was a miracle, a black kid from New York accepted in to the Naval Academy." Upon graduation, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps and spent the next thirteen years on active duty, serving in Desert Storm in Saudi Arabia and Desert Shield in Kuwait. He then entered the reserves and retired two years after 911 as a Lieutenant Colonel.

His father Earl F. Mosely was a high school history teacher and later a principal and his mother Marilvn Elene was also involved in education. Kevin has an older sister Donna who is a respected artist. Although his parents encouraged Kevin to become a teacher, it wasn't until a friend suggested it to him that he applied and accepted a substitute position at Donovan High School in Toms River. After two weeks of subbing, when a position became available, the principal offered him a teaching job; at the same time, a company he had applied for a position with also offered a job. Faced with this

> decision, Kevin turned to the Lord. "God said, 'Stay where you're planted' and I stayed there for five years." While attending the Church of Grace and Peace, he was offered the job of principal at the church academy. "God opened another door. My wife Marcie was already teaching there. Three of my children attended the academy."

> Kevin and Marcie met in the East End Baptist Church in Brooklyn. They dated in college and were married in 1980. They have six children. Oldest daughter Tiffa-



ny attended Nyack College and is now a teacher at a charter school in the Bronx. Candace attended Georgetown University and now works there as a coordinator of programs. Ashley went to Randolph-Macon College and is now a stay at home mom to Weston, 2, and Ezekiel, 7 months. Christopher went to Elizabethtown College and now works at a prison in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Lauren attended Washington and Lee University and is currently teaching English in Japan. Mark is completing his junior year at The Catholic University in Washington, D.C.

Currently, Mr. Mosely is a teacher of history and politics at Brick Memorial High School and also serves as the district Anti-Bullying Coordinator. Although he didn't plan to follow in his father's footsteps, Kevin admits, "I'm a teacher at heart. I'm a classroom person. You need to know your gifting. I'm better in a classroom than in an office." At Harmony Ministries, Mr. Mosely is also a Sunday school teacher for the fourth and fifth graders. Marcie is a flight attendant for United Airlines.

The Mosely family has been at Harmony for eleven years. Kevin was raised in the church and accepted Jesus as his Savior while a teenager. His favorite scripture is the one his father wrote in his first Bible, Proverbs 3: 5-6, Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your paths. Kevin admits, "There is no question who has directed my life. There is no logical reason for my getting from point A to B." In Hope or In Faith?

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Hebrews 11:1

Too often faith and hope are used synonymously. At a closer glance, we understand the meaning of each. Faith is defined as complete trust or confidence in someone or something, whereas, hope is a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen. God makes it very clear, faith is now. Faith brings into reality those things we hope or long for.

NOW FAITH is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things [we] do not see and the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses]. Hebrews 11:1 Amp

God goes on to give an example of what He means. By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible. Hebrews 11:3

The account of creation clearly shows God speaking the world into existence. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light" (Genesis 1:3). Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb that yields seed, and the fruit tree that yields fruit according to its kind, whose seed is in itself, on the earth"; and it was so. Genesis 1:11

He was calling things into existence, just as He called Abraham the father of many nations, despite his aged body and the barrenness of Sarah's womb. Abraham ...in the presence of Him whom he be-lieved---God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did; who, contrary to hope, in hope believed, so that he became the father of many nations, according to what was spoken, "So shall your descendants be." Romans 4:17b-18

Therefore, contrary to hope, not in hope, but rather in hope believed, meaning... in faith became the father of many nations despite what it looked like. In fact, he acted in faith. He went about trying to become what God was calling him. Even though mistakes may have been made along the way, it

was his faith, not his goodness that earned him righteousness.

Abraham never wavered in believing God's promise. In fact, his faith grew stronger, and in this he brought glory to God. And when God counted him as righteous, it wasn't just for Abraham's benefit. It was recorded for our benefit, too, assuring us that God will also count us as righteous if we believe in him, the one who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. Romans 4:20-24 NLT

You see, God deposited in each of us a measure of faith (Romans 12:3). Understanding the race we would run, He gave us everything we need. The transference of these promises is done through faith. Many times Jesus would say to His disciples, "O ye of little faith?" (Matthew 6:30, 8:26, 14:31, 16:8). However, those who were healed, He acknowledged that it was according to their faith. When He healed the woman with the issue of blood, He said, "Daughter, be of good comfort; thy faith hath made thee whole" (Matthew 9:22). When He healed the blind men, He said, "According to your faith be it unto you" (Matthew 9:29). He even tells us that if we have faith as a mustard seed, that we can move mountains, and that nothing would be impossible to us (Matthew 17:20). He also explains that He can do "exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us" (Ephesians 3:20). What is that power? We know as believers the Holy Spirit lives in us and empowers us, but doesn't this power include faith? When we release our faith, it gives God permission to move on our behalf. Remember...Jesus told them be it unto you according to your faith.

"Faith brings into reality those things we hope or long for." "Now, the just shall live by faith; but if anyone

"Now, the just shall live by faith; but if anyone draws back, my soul has no pleasure in him" (Hebrews 10:38 NKJ). This does not say the just shall live by hope. "Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them" (Mark 11:24). This does not say whatever things you ask when you pray, hope that you receive them. Faith is confidence in God and His word. Abraham was fully persuaded that God would keep His word.

BUT MY RIGHTEOUS ONE [the one justified by faith] SHALL LIVE BY FAITH [respecting man's relationship to God and trusting Him]; AND IF HE DRAWS BACK [shrinking in fear], MY SOUL HAS NO DELIGHT IN HIM. But our way is not that of those who shrink back to destruction, but [we are] of those who believe [relying on God through faith in Jesus Christ, the Messiah] and by this confident faith preserve the soul. Hebrews 10:38, 39 AMP

So I ask, are you in hope or in faith?

When one talks about LOVE, we generally go to the book of Corinthians: Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres. Love never fails."

I Corinthians 13:4-8a (NIV)

These qualities can certainly be found in the person of Jesus Christ, and they can be found in all truly loving relationships. The problem with trying to "find" love in our daily lives, is that too often we don't look for these characteristics. Rather we look at physical appearance, popularity, or wealth. These are not the qualities that God looks at and neither should we.

But the LORD said to Samuel, "...The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." -I Samuel 16:7b (NIV)

Love is best seen as devotion and action, not an emotion. Love is not exclusively based on how we feel. Certainly our emotions are involved, but they cannot be our only criteria for love. True devotion will always lead to action—true love.

A Genuine Love For God

How can you tell if you really love God? Here are some indicators of whether your love for God is real. You will long for personal communion with Him. When you really love someone, you like to spend time with him or her. And if you really love God, then you will want to be in fellowship with Him.

You will love the things that He loves. We know what God loves by what He has declared in His Word. The psalmist said, "I rejoice at Your word as one who finds great treasure" (Psalm 119:162).

You will hate the things that He hates. Psalm 97:10 says, "Let those who love the Lord hate evil. . . ." Romans 12:9 tells us to "abhor what is evil" and "cling to what is good." See evil as God sees it.

You will love other Christians. In 1 John 3:14 we read, "We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love the brethren. He who does not love his brother abides in death." Don't say that you love God while you harbor hatred toward fellow believers.

You will keep His commandments. Jesus said, "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me . . ." (John 14:21). If you love God, then you will do what He says.

If you love God, the proof will be in your actions. I challenge you to LOVE!

Follow God's Example



God wants us to imitate Him, walk in His footprints and show the same kind of love He freely gave to us. It's not enough to just hear God's word; He wants us to be doers of His word. The Word tells us if we don't have love for one another, we are nothing (1Corinthians 13:2).

The word "love" has been taken out of context and most of the time it's based on conditions, feelings and emotions which is not the type of love God wants us to have for one another. If you ask people what love means to them, you will get many examples and some will include family, homes, cars, clothing, jewelry and the list continues. The love God wants us to focus on is God's *agape* love. This is the love that Jesus spoke about when He sinners. Jesus tells us in Psalm103:12 that our sins are removed as far as the east is from the west and He will never remember our sins again. Then we worship

told us to love one another and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Before we can love one another with the love of Christ, we have to know the meaning of that love, agape *love*. Agape love is something inward which shows itself in action. Agape love is most clearly seen in God's giving His Son to die for us while we were yet



the living God who rose on the third day. Because He lives, we have so much praise and worship for our one and only true living God. *Agape* love is love God's way, pure with no conditions. When Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose on Resurrection Sunday, that is God's agape love.

We show God we love Him through our obedience to His word, doing



exactly what He tells us to do. The more we study the Bible, the closer our relationship with Christ becomes. God provides us with the best instructions on how to live a full and productive life; it's all written and available for us in the Bible. As our obedience to God's word increases, our relationship with Christ increases and our love for one another will continue to grow.

"So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved vou. vou should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." John 13:34 - 35


tionally love and have a forgiving heart. When God cleanses and heals us by His love, He enables us to forgive and wipe away all division and discord and unite us as one!

God's love flows through us to others as we yield ourselves to Him to be vessels for His love. He makes it possible for us to say to others, "I love you because God has placed within me His

wonderful love for you." This agape love is so powerful it enables us to love even the unlovable. We have to remember when we interact with others we are to display the characteristics of Christ. What type of **LOVE** are you displaying?

No one has ever seen God. But if we love each other, God lives in us, and his love is brought to full expression in us. And God has given us his Spirit as proof that we live in him and he in us. 1 John 4:12 - 13

On February 10, 2018, Harmony Ministries enjoyed the best hot coffee Harmony has to offer with "cops" from the Lakehurst and Manchester Township Police Departments. The purpose of the meeting was to unite law enforcement and the community. What better way to begin unity than with the local body of Christ? The most valuable lesson taken from the meeting was "Respecting Those in Leadership Positions". Respecting leadership positions is required not because you want it to, because you're a good person, or even because it's what your parents taught you; but for understanding the mere fact that our Father says "all authority" comes from Him. Those who are in

leadership positions have been placed there by Him and when we rebel against authority, we are essentially rebelling against God.

If you were looking to see how to sneak out of a speeding ticket or ways to get around the law, I assure you that this was not the forum for you. However, there were important topics discussed and hard questions were answered. The group discussed everything from being scammed on telephone calls to questions on how to keep from being the next unarmed victim. It was noted very early on in the meeting that good law abiding cops don't wake up in the morning ready to kill someone. In fact, police departments are highly trained to deal with adverse situations and report that it is a great day when their firearms are not used. They shared ways to keep safe when stopped by a police office on the highway such as turning the dome light on in the vehicle, having the necessary documents out and prepared for the officer, driving to a well-lit area in cases where you feel your safety may be compromised, and not reaching for anything in a swift manner. Like us, cops want to get home safely to their families. As long as we have empathy for each other, ask for wisdom and knowledge from our Father, follow the law, and allow the angels of God to take charge over our life, we can know assuredly that God will protect us. Remember, we should treat every person with kindness and respect, even those who are not kind in return. We show compassion to others not because of who they are but because of who we are in Christ Jesus. Thank you to the Lakehurst and Manchester Police Departments for partnering with the local body of Christ to ensure the safety of all fellow citizens. This is truly a great start.

Respect for Authority Romans 13:1-5 (NLT)

1 Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God.

2 So anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished.

3 For the authorities do not strike fear in people who are doing right, but in those who are doing wrong. Would you like to live without fear of the authorities? Do what is right, and they will honor you.

4 The authorities are God's servants, sent for your good. But if you are doing wrong, of course you should be afraid, for they have the power to punish you. They are God's servants, sent for the very purpose of punishing those who do what is wrong.



A preacher once explained grace with this acronym:

God's - Riches - At - Christ's - Expense PRAY THIS PRAYER OUT LOUD:

Heavenly Father, In Jesus' name I repent of my sins and open my heart to let Jesus come inside of me. Jesus, You are my Lord and Savior. I believe you died for my sins and you were raised from the dead. Fill me with your Holy Spirit. Thank you Father, for saving me in Jesus' name. Amen.

If you've prayed this prayer of salvation with true conviction, you are now a follower of Jesus.




