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
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The Long-Suffering Of GOD

"But the rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not repent of the works of their hands, that they should not worship demons, and idols of gold, silver, brass, stone, and wood, which can neither see nor hear nor walk. And they did not repent of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts."

(Revelation 9:20,21)

Without a doubt, God's desire is for the salvation of all men. The scriptures clearly reveal the nature of God, "God is Love." Therefore, it matters not what may be going on at any time, the bottom line is that God desires all men to receive His Son Jesus. This is seen as God speaks through the apostle Peter - "But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance." (I Peter 3:8,9)

God has revealed many things to us that are going to take place in these last days. There

are many things revealed to us in the book of Revelation concerning the End Time, and some of these things are very dark. Now, the question may be asked, if God is Love, then why all the darkness? Well, the answer is this: God's love for mankind is so rich that He is willing to activate every possible method to bring men to repentance. The initial act of God's love was to offer His Son for us. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

Now that we have a picture of God's love for us, we can better understand the intent of Revelation. Let us review the tactic of God in a four step process:

God provided the provisions for our salvation – "With his own blood—not the blood of goats and calves—he entered the Most Holy Place once for all time and secured our redemption forever." (Hebrews 9:12 (NLT)

God pleads for all men to come to Him: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

God reviews the many benefits offered us as the result of receiving His Son:

"Bless the Lord, O my soul, And forget not all His benefits: Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases, Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies, Who satisfies your mouth with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the eagle's. (Psalm 103:2-5)

A future benefit is a place with God in Heaven: "In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you and if I go and prepare a

place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also."

God gives us the consequence of rejecting Jesus. God is complete in all that He does. It's imperative that He reveal to us the consequence of rejecting His Son:

"Then I saw a great white throne and Him who heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books. The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works. Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire." (Revelation 20:1-15)

If you believe that Jesus is the Christ, then you are born of God and your name is written in the Book of Life. Amen!



Your purpose or God's plan for you was predestined before you were born. We know Jeremiah was a major prophet of the Old Testament, but God is no respecter of persons, meaning He shows no partiality or favor amongst His children. So like He spoke to Jeremiah, He is speaking to you. "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11 NIV)

"In Him we also were made [God's] heritage (portion) and we obtained an inheritance; for we had been foreordained (chosen and appointed beforehand) in accordance with His

purpose, Who works out everything in agreement with the counsel and design of His [own] will." (Ephesians 1:11 AMP)

You may think, what possibly could God use me to do? But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man, the things which God has prepared for those who love Him." (1 Corinthians 2:9 NKJV)

In His word, He shares stories of everyday people who were chosen for their time. We see their lives transformed over the pages of the Bible, as they conform each day, or each year, to what He desired of them, through their love and obedience to Him. Joseph is one such story. He is one of the twelve sons of Jacob, or twelve tribes of Israel. His story begins in Gene-

sis 37. Gifted with the ability to interpret dreams which would later position him as second in command in Egypt, Joseph endured many trials and tribulations before his assignment was clear. He was betrayed by his brothers, who sold him into slavery and then told their father he was devoured by a wild beast. He was taken into Egypt and sold to Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh. Potiphar's wife desired him and when he refused, she lied saying he came to sleep with her, and he was taken to prison. While in prison, he interpreted the dreams of the chief butler and chief baker of Pharaoh's court who were also imprisoned. He later interpreted the dreams of Pharaoh.

Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, "Inasmuch as God has shown you all this, there is no one as discerning and wise as you. You shall be over my house, and all my people shall be ruled ac-

cording to your word; only in regard to the throne will I be greater than you." And Pharaoh said to Joseph, "See I have set you over all the land of Egypt." Then Pharaoh took his signet ring off his hand and put it on Joseph's hand; and he clothed him in garments of fine linen and put a gold chain around his neck. And he had him ride in the second chariot which he had and they cried out before him, "Bow the knee!" So he set him over all the land of Egypt. Pharaoh also said to Joseph, "I am Pharaoh, and without your consent no man may lift his hand or foot in all the land of Egypt." (Genesis 41:39-44 NKJV)

In accordance with Pharaoh's dreams, God brought seven years of plenty and seven years of famine throughout all the land. During the years of plenty, Joseph gathered and stored enough food for the time of famine. So all coun-



tries came to Joseph in Egypt to buy grain, because the famine was severe in all lands. (Genesis 41:57 NKJV)

Joseph's position allowed the entrance of the children of Israel, his father, brothers, and family into the land of plenty during a famine. When Joseph revealed himself to his brothers, he told them with no resentment, "But now, do not be distressed and disheartened or vexed and angry with yourselves because you sold me here, for God sent me ahead of you to preserve life... God sent me before you to preserve for you a posterity and to continue a remnant on the earth, to save your lives by a great escape and save for you many survivors." (Genesis 45:5, 7 AMP)

When Joseph saw his brothers, his assignment was clear. Many years had passed, but God had never left him, despite what it looked like. The Lord was with Joseph, and he was a successful man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian. And his master saw that the Lord was

with him and that the Lord made all he did to prosper in his hand. (Genesis 39:2, 3 NKJV) But the Lord was with Joseph and showed him mercy, and He gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison. And the keeper of the prison committed to Joseph's hand all the prisoners who were in the prison; whatever they did there, it was his doing. The keeper of the prison did not look into anything that was under Joseph's authority, because the Lord was with him; and whatever he did, the Lord made it prosper. (Genesis 39:21-23 NKJV) Despite the fact that Joseph was a slave and a prisoner, the Lord was with him. Joseph found favor in the sight of Potiphar and the keeper of the prison because he was upright, living a life pleasing to God. God never rescinded His gift, and Joseph used his gift through the years as instructed by God. Joseph never lost his fellowship with God, he knew who he was and whose he was. The plan God preordained for him, before he was in his mother's womb was established. God even





gave him a glimpse of it when He showed Joseph the dream of his brothers bowing down to him. (Genesis 37:5-11)

God has a preordained plan for you, and it is established. Acknowledge the gifts and talents He has given you. He has equipped you with these gifts for a reason, and know the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. (Romans 11:29 NKJV) As you continue to seek Him through prayer and His Word, in time His plan will be revealed to you. Do not be moved by what you see, by circumstances, or disappointments, but stay focused on Him, who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began. (2 Timothy 1:9 NKJV) Even before he made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy and without fault in his eyes. God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to himself through Jesus Christ. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure. (Ephesians 1:4, 5 NLT)

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you [and approved of you as My chosen instrument], And before you were born I consecrated you [to Myself as My own]. (Jeremiah 1:5 AMP) God is speaking...you are chosen and you are predestined.





- 11. I don't think it is fair that something is not being done at my school to allow my graduating class to wald at graduation. There are so many alternatives.




Plans after High school: Attending William Paterson University



During this COVID 19 pandemic we can remember on our brother Daniel who remained steadfast and unfailing in his faith




and trust in God.

God reminds us that uneasy times will occur in Isaiah 43:2, "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through the fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you." God always demonstrates His sovereignty and power in difficult and troubled times. We recall that God's Word is our shield and refuge. The Word says, "Whoever gives thought to the word will discover good and blessed is he who trusts in the Lord" (Proverbs 16:20). God will receive the glory from this pandemic. Many individuals will turn to the Almighty and powerful God as they establish that the scientists, the doctors, and many others don't have the world's answers. God has been moving in historical times, establishing the destinies of generations and will continue to do so. Despite new reports and personal discomforts, we are confident that nothing is too great for our God. We will continue to constantly apply the Word over our lives for God's Word is "living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of heart" (Hebrews 4:12. His redemptive power is inexhaustible and constant. We will continue to trust and believe God's Word in these troubled periods for we walk by faith, not by sight.

However, I would like to direct you to Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by Grace are you saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God; Not of works, lest any man should boast."

Grace is mentioned over 100 times in the Bible. Grace is God's unmerited favor and because of God's grace, we receive eternal life and a promise of heaven. Grace is necessary for salvation as we cannot do enough good works or make enough right choices to earn our salvation. The Bible teaches that we are justified by the grace of God (Romans 3:24; Titus 3:7). Justified means declared not guilty. When we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior, all charges against us are dropped and we are free from sin. When God forgives our sins, the record is wiped clean. It is as if we had never sinned.

A preacher once explained grace with this acronym:

God's - Riches - At - Christ's - Expense PRAY THIS PRAYER OUT LOUD:

Heavenly Father, In Jesus' name I repent of my sins and open my heart to let Jesus come inside of me. Jesus, You are my Lord and Savior. I believe you died for my sins and you were raised from the dead. Fill me with your Holy Spirit. Thank you Father, for saving me in Jesus' name. Amen.



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
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

Sir Isaac Newton's Law of Inertia states that an object in motion will stay in motion unless acted upon by an outside force. Conversely an object at rest will stay at rest unless acted upon by an outside force. It is in the middle of the two that true balance exists, where things move at times and are at rest at times. We know that rest is necessary in order to for a person to have adequate energy to get things done. Like most natural laws this just makes sense, it is part of creation that goes all the way back to the beginning; after six days of work building everything, even God rested.

There are many places in the scriptures that show that rest is an important, if not critical, thing for a healthy life. We of course know of the mandate of the Sabbath and the holy days described in the books of Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers, but there are references to the importance of rest throughout the Bible. There are references in the Psalms; "He makes me to lie down in green pastures" Psalm 23:2 and Psalm 37: "Rest in the Lord,

and wait patiently for Him." for example. In Exodus 23:12 the Lord says, "You have six days each week for your ordinary work, but on the seventh day you must stop working. This gives your ox and your donkey a chance to rest. It also allows your slaves and the foreigners living among you to be refreshed." This instruction for the Sabbath is not just for us to rest, but for all our workers, even those who do not have the same beliefs we do. Rest is important for everyone, not just the believer. We need to be cognizant of the need for everyone to rest.

Even Jesus took time off for rest, Matthew 8:24 "Suddenly, a fierce storm struck the lake, with waves breaking into the boat. But Jesus was sleeping." "Then Jesus said, 'let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile.'" Mark 6:30 He wasn't always left alone long enough for what we today would consider a good and healthy rest time, nor did he always have a place to rest, as He says in Matthew 8:20 (NLT) "Foxes have dens to



live in, and birds have nests, but the Son of Manhas no place even to lay His head."

Jesus also tells us that there is true rest in Him. Also, in the Gospel account of St. Matthew Jesus tells us "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and my burden is light." Matthew 11:29-30 We know that Jesus was fully God and fully human, and so needed to physically take time off to recharge His batteries. We know for example that He spent time with friends like Lazarus and his sisters Mary and Martha, and that when Martha chastised her sister for not helping with the serving of the guests Jesus told her that Mary had chosen the better in spending time with Him because He would not always be with


them, well not physically as He was then.

Pastor recently taught about the twenty-fourhour day and how it applies to how we should organize and discipline our lives. Eight hours of the day are meant for work, eight for sleeping and eight for socialization and life. God was pretty smart when he set up the day in this way. It was in the basic design for us to have a good long rest to recharge our bodies. We know from experience that when we get adequate rest, we are more prepared to face the day and live up to the calling of God on our lives. Take the time God allotted for you and get a good long rest. It is, after all, built into the day for you and as Pastor has taught us, when God gives you a gift the only response needed is to say thank you.
