

"7"Behold, I am coming quickly! Blessed is he who keeps the words of the prophecy of this book."12 "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to every one according to his work. 13 I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the First and the Last." 16 I Jesus, have sent My angel to testify to you these things in the churches. I am the Root and the offspring of David, the Bright and Morning Star."20 He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming quickly. " (Revelation 22:7,12,13, 16,20)

This is without a doubt the defining hour of our journey. When we consider the urgency in the final words of Jesus to the Church, we can not help but know the value of the time that we are in.

We are approaching the thirty year mark of our ministry here at Harmony Church. It has been our goal to hold up the bloodstained banner of Jesus Christ without compromise from the very beginning. Because of this commitment, God has been extremely gracious in allowing us to have attained such a landmark. When I consider the final words of Jesus to the church as found in the book of Revelation, I am more determined to lock in on the calling that He has given us. According to God's word, I am in Christ, ("if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation") if this is true, and it is, then when I hear the urgent plea in Jesus' final words to the church, "behold I am coming quickly"- I am compelled to fulfill my purpose and calling. In these final words of Jesus as outlined in the above text, we see a display of love and concern for the world that should cause us to totally commit to whatever ministry we have been called to. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life". This is why there is such a passion in these final words of Jesus to the church. God says in His word that He is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9). This very love with which God has loved us, He has poured out into our hearts by the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). Therefore, the same



passion that is displayed in these words of Jesus should be in us also.

This great commandment of love must be received by us, if we are to fulfill the calling that God has given us. Love is not an option. It is a mandate. "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another." (John 13:34). And again, He says in Galatians 5:14,

"Stop looking at what you see people do, and just love them where they are".

"For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." I am totally persuaded that the key to the fulfillment of our calling is determined by the choice we make in receiving the love commandment. If we are to develop in the passion that we see demonstrated in the words of Jesus, we must without a doubt receive His love. Most of the distractions that we encounter are designed by the adversary to separate us from the love commandment. Once that is accomplished, you will not fulfill your calling. God taught me how to love people by teaching me to stop finding fault with them.

The passion that God has developed in me is the result of my love for people. I don't want to see anyone lost, so the result of that is that I do everything that I can to point everyone to Jesus. I am 73 years old and I love people more today than I ever have. Don't stop reading at John 3:16, read verse 17, "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." Stop looking at what you see people do and just love them where they are. You are not responsible for what people are doing. Your responsibility is to love them and do what ever you can to point them to Jesus.

I encourage you to read and meditate on these final words of Jesus to the church, and I am certain there will be a greater passion in you to fulfill your calling. "Who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began" (II Timothy 1:9).

Casting Your Cares By Resisting Fear

Casting the whole of your care (all anxieties, all your worries, all your concerns, once and for all on Him, for He cares for you affectionately and cares about you watchfully! (1Peter 5:7AMPC)

Jesus is our Caretaker. He takes our cares as we commit them to Him.

The phrase "Fear Not" is used seventy- two times in the Old Testament and twenty- three times in the New Testament. Fear is the polar opposite of faith. You cannot be in fear and faith at the same time. The two spirits cannot occupy the same space. "Fear Not" is not a suggestion, but a powerful command from God.

The word *worry* is included with the word *care*. All worry, all care is fear based. Worry is a sin, because Jesus said. "Don't do it." We are to humble ourselves under the mighty hand of God, and He will exalt us in due time, because the adversary, the devil, is seeking who he can devour (1Peter 5:5-9) AMPC.

The devil can't devour you unless you open the door of doubt and unbelief.

The word translated care means anxiety, distress, uneasiness of mind, caused by fear. Worrying is to torment oneself with cares, anxieties, and concerns. They come from the same spirit. The spirit of satan himself!

According to 1 Peter 5:10, "The God of all grace, after you have suffered, will perfect, establish, strengthen and settle you." Suffering in this passage means "resisting"; we are to

resist everything that Jesus bore on the cross for us. We are to resist sin, poverty, sickness, and disease, every part of the whole curse.

Jesus taught that the Word of God is a seed that must be sown in the fertile ground of our hearts and tended to in order to produce a harvest. As we sow the Word, through reading, meditating, listening, speaking and hearing it, the devil comes immediately to take it away according to Mark 4:15-19. The devil is after the Word, because without it we are powerless. He comes only to steal, kill, and destroy (John10:10).

Faith comes by hearing the Word of God (Romans 10:17). *NO WORD, NO FAITH, NO VICTORY!* If the devil can steal the Word from you, he has the rest of your life and the plan that God predestined before the foundation of the world.

Jesus taught that the Word is choked by cares, anxieties, distress, uneasiness of mind caused by fear of danger or misfortune of this world, the deceitfulness of riches and the lust (pressure) of other things.

If you are worried, the power of God will not work through you as it should. Self induced worry and stress are the cause of ninety-eight percent of all chronic diseases. Jesus has given you authority over fear and all the works of the devil and his forces. "Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions and over all the power of the enemy and nothing shall by any means hurt you "(Luke 10:19 NKJV).

Jesus our Prince of Peace, who gives peace, said in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." You will never be able to attain peace from any other source but Jesus.

Jesus is our perfect example of love. There is no fear in love. Mature love casts out all fear (John 4:18)

Faith works by love; fear works by worry (Galatians 5:6). Fear has torment and distress; he who fears is not mature in love.

God has given us the authority to get rid of all fear, so don't ask Him to deliver you from it, because He has already put that responsibility in your hands through His Word!



Faith works by love, and grace works by faith. God gives grace to the humble, so cast every care, worry, anxiety, concern once and for all on Him and leave it there because He is faithful to His Word and He will exalt you in every situation in due time. HUMBLE YOURSELF,TRUST HIM AND RECEIVE THE VICTORY!!

If you are ready to commit to God the fear in your life, here is your start.

Pray this prayer to defeat fear in your life:

Father, in the Name of Jesus, I accept Your peace. I will not let my heart be troubled. I reject fear in every form. I will trust your love, and I will cast my cares on You! Thank you for Your love and faithfulness. In Jesus' Name. Amen





"Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses." I Timothy 6:12 NKJ

Believers have been called to fight. The Bible is clear that we have to be self-controlled and alert. "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour" (I Peter 5:8). Yet, we do this knowing we are victorious because of the finished work of Jesus Christ. "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

Too often believers are caught off guard by the deceptions of the enemy. Salvation is defined as the deliverance from sin and its consequences for Christians who have accepted Jesus Christ and have faith in Him as their Lord and Savior, but Christians must practice their faith. James 2 tells us that faith without works is dead. "Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure" (Philippians 2:12-13). He has given us everything we need to be victorious, but we must lay hold on eternal life. That means there is action on our part... we must keep His word, we must study to show ourselves approved (II Timothy 2:15), we must endure hardship as a good soldier (II Timothy 2:3), we must be strong in the Lord (Ephesians 6:10), and we must put on the whole armor of God (Ephesians 6:11).

He warns us that we will have to "stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:11b-12). It is a spiritual war, and even though our spirit is willing, our flesh is weak (Matthew 26:41). However, "the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ." (II Corinthians 10:4-5). Remember, "it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure (Philippians 2:13). Jesus said, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep my word; and My Father will love Him, and We will come to Him and make Our home with him" (John 14:23). When He said He will never leave or forsake us, He meant it. He is always there, always speaking, always encouraging, always chastising, always loving, and when He says fight, we fight!

"Therefore put on God's complete armor, that you may be able to resist and stand your ground on the evil day [of danger], and, having done all [the crisis demands], to stand [firmly in your place]. Stand therefore [hold your ground], having tightened the belt of truth around your loins and having put on the breastplate of integrity and of moral rectitude and right standing with God, and having shod your feet in preparation [to face the enemy with the firm-footed stability, the promptness, and the readiness produced by the good news] of the Gospel of peace. Lift up over all the [covering] shield of saving faith, upon which you can quench all the flaming missiles of the wicked [one]. And take the helmet of salvation and the sword that the Spirit wields, which is the Word of God." (Ephesians 6: 13-17 AMP)

Prepare yourself like a good soldier for the fight, "praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints" (Ephesians 6:18 NKJ). You must also keep the good confession of faith knowing the greater one lives in you, that no weapon formed against you will prosper, and that you will live the abundant life that Jesus came to give you because you are in God's full armor.

Then when your time is at hand, you can say, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished my race, I have kept the faith. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day." (II Timothy 2:7-8b)

This is your fight...fight the fight of faith like a good soldier.

Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere. Ephesians 6:18

Make a habit of making time for Jesus every day and you'll soon find that you have more peace and joy as you carry out the other things on your busy agenda each day and your load will feel lighter because you'll soon realize that none of it matters anyway, except for Jesus. Jesus truly is Jehovah Jireh, our Provider, and nothing

under the sun is more important than finding out about Him and growing closer to Him. Wise Solomon told us that he tried everything there is to try and possessed everything that there is to possess and through all of it he found that the only thing that satisfies is Jesus. The Lord told Martha directly that all that is necessary is to seek His presence, and He said that when we put Him first, all things will be added to us. For me, "having all things added to me" includes the realization that this life is temporary, and therefore despite what it may look like at any given moment in this temporary world, I can have every confidence and assurance that everything will ultimately be all right. My eye is on the prize, and my goal is to be eternally worshipping God in Heaven, and that is the key to having the satisfaction and rest that we all seek. When we say 'yes' to Jesus, we will fulfill the calling that He has given to us and for which we were designed by Him to do. 


