


conceptions about God and Christianity that are probably not uncommon today. I thought that in sharing these, I might help others.

"For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ" (II Corinthian 10:4, 5 NKJV).

God uses the language of war. He tells us to fight the good fight of faith. He tells us to put on the full armor of God because He knows that despite the victory we have in Christ, the enemy still wages war on the minds of the believers. This battle began in heaven. Lucifer was able to convince some of the angelic hosts to believe a lie. He did it in the garden with Adam and Eve and he continues to do it today. God makes it clear that it is spiritual warfare, and our weapons are not carnal or physical but mighty in God for breaking strongholds and everything that causes confusion and distracts us from our purpose. The enemy does not have any new tricks. He attempted to exalt himself above God in heaven and Jesus

said He saw him fall like lightning to the earth. The devil continues to wage war in the minds of believers here on earth by trying to exalt his lies against the truth, but God instructs us to take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ.

How do we take a thought captive? Captivity is the condition of being imprisoned or confined. To take a thought captive is to confine it, isolate and analyze it. If it does not align with the Word of God, then we should snatch it and cast it down before it takes root in our mind. These fiery darts of the enemy are intended to destroy our peace and steal our joy. Although to snatch it and cast it down is speaking figuratively, we have to be that aggressive in our battle

for peace which is why we are instructed to use His weapons of warfare by putting on the full armor of God. "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil" (Ephesians 6:10,11). God is being very clear here: it is a battle against the wiles, that is, the devious or cunning schemes or strategies the devil uses to manipulate and persuade people to believe his lies. He will use anyone, even those closest to us, to say or do things to send us reeling, but remember, "we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against powers, against rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12).

God says we should take the "shield of faith with which you will be able to quench the fiery darts of the wicked one" (Ephesians 6:16) because any time spent entertaining the lies of the enemy is wasted time. The Amplified Bible puts it this way, "Lift up over all the (covering) shield of saving faith, upon which you can quench all the flaming missiles of the wicked (one)." The Lord lets us know these fiery darts can be as strong as flaming missiles, but we are to be prepared by lifting the shield of faith. This shield, characterized as a broad piece of metal, is part of our daily armor used to protect us from his attacks. Our hearts are therefore protected and those darts or missiles will be extinguished before they come near our bodies. We should also "take on the helmet of

salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Ephesians 6:17) so if any dart or missile gets past the shield, the helmet of salvation protects our mind. The Holy Spirit lives in us and His sword will strike down every attack of the enemy. We stay built up or fortified by reading or feeding on the word daily to keep our strength.

"We are human, but we don't wage war as humans do. We use God's mighty weapons, not worldly weapons, to knock down the strongholds of human reasoning and to destroy false arguments" (II Corinthians 10:3, 4 NLT). Sometimes we need to talk to ourselves, and even yell to make it clear that we are Christ's. "That utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as Ι ought speak" (Ephesians 6:19, 20 NKJV). I believe, so I speak. "No weapon that is

formed against you will succeed; and every tongue that rises against you in judgment you will condemn. This (peace, righteousness, security, and triumph over opposition) is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and this is their vindication from Me," says the Lord (Isaiah 54:17 AMP). Even Satan bows to Jesus! He can say what he wants, but he is a liar and a defeated foe.

"Set your mind and keep focused habitually on the things above (the heavenly things), not on things that are on the earth (which have only temporal value)" (Colossians 3:2 AMP). We are structed to think on those things that are true, noble, pure, lovely, "whatever things are of good report, if there is anything praiseworthy-meditate on things" (Philippians 4:8 NKJV). Keep control of your mind by taking thoughts captive and bringing them in obedience to the truth of Christ.





Fear not, for you shall not be ashamed; neither be confounded and depressed, for you shall not be put to shame. For you shall forget the shame of your youth, and you shall not (seriously) remember the reproach of your widowhood anymore. For your Maker is your Husband- the Lord of Hosts is his name- and the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer; the God of the whole earth He is called. Isaiah 54:4-5



Unfortunately, due to centuries of artists' renderings of the Holy Spirit as a bird, most people, including devout Christians do not really comprehend who and what the Holy Spirit is. We know that Jesus told us that He was going to send us a helper, but how often do we forget that this helper is a person, not just a "power" or "force" and most certainly not a bird! "But when the [a] Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me" (John 15:26).

It is easy for us to picture Jesus as a man. We have direct quotations of things that He Himself said while He walked the earth about 2,000 years ago. We can glean from artists' renderings that Jesus had manly features and each of us has some image in our mind of what He

must look like. We do not have a problem seeing the Son of God as a person because we have been taught that He is and will always be a Man and God, a theological concept called the Hypostatic Union.

Thanks in no small part to the paintings by Michelangelo on the Sistine Chapel in Rome, we can even have a mental image of God the Father in human form. Most of us envision the Father as an elderly man with long white flowing hair and a matching beard. There are countless paintings and images of what people have imagined the Father must look like. Much of the reasoning for the images of God the Father are based on the verse from Genesis 1:26 where God says on the sixth day of creation, "Let us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness." The likeness that He

speaks of in this verse is that we, like God are triune being; in our case, we are Spirit, Soul, and Body. In the case of the Lord of all creation, Father, Son and Spirit.

What we need to keep in mind when it comes to the Holy Spirit is He is a person, has personality, and has will. The Holy Spirit is every bit the person we have no problem seeing in the Father and in the

Son. In the novel/film The Shack, the Holy Spirit finally is rendered as a person in the role portrayed beautifully by actress Sumire Matsubara. The Holy Spirit was the enacting power that brought Jesus back out of Hell and gave Him the power to rise on the third day. Living In The Overflow of Christ

Romans 8:16-17 (NLT)

16 For His Spirit joins with our spirit to affirm that we are God's children. 17 And since we are His children, we are His heirs. In fact, together with Christ we are heirs of God's glory. But if we are to share his glory, we must also share His suffering.

We join the gym. We join clubs. We join store club memberships. We join reward club restaurants, club Med and the list goes on. Then we join the body of Christ.

The BOC isn't like those other clubs. By the way some people talk, you would think they were. How many believers actually fully understood what happened to them? We join Club Christ and get a variety of lies about what we are getting into. "Oh, your life will get better." Instead, it got worse. They told me that God would return everything the devil stole. I cringed, and thought to myself he can keep it!

Let's face it, in the beginning of our membership (LoI), we understand and know very little of this club that is filled with many contradictions and beliefs. In Kyle Idleman's book Not a Fan, he takes you on an incredible journey to show how little we know about great sports figures. For instance, if you met Lebron James and had a conversation with him, you will be at a loss for words because you only know him by a limited pool of knowledge and secondhand information. Your knowledge of Lebron

would be limited to "Google" knowledge. i.e. statistics, height, public quotations and comments he's made through the years, and marital status. Does this constitute you as an expert on everything Lebron? Absolutely not!

It's the same issue we have

with Christ. We say that we want to live in the overflow of Christ. We mean well, our hearts are right, but we lack the discipline to study the Word and / or to believe what we are reading.

The biggest step to living in the overflow of Christ, is a simple affirmation. Remember that SNL skit that Al Franken did in "Daily Affirmations" with Stuart Smalley, where he sits in front of a mirror and tries to encourage himself? In some aspects that's what we need to do, the only thing is that The Lord leads us in the affirmations we need.

Our scripture verse 16 says "For his Spirit joins with our spirit to affirm that we are God's children."


We see a double entry Spirit and spirit. So many times we are trained to think Holy Spirit, but when we read further into the verse, we see he says, "In fact, together with Christ we are heirs of God's glory." Paul is addressing a supernatural union between God, Christ = Divinity (Spirit) and carnal (spirit) bankrupt flesh.

Notice that God takes the initiative, "His spirit joins". This is a supernatural process, a powerful process. The Lord is not looking for shallow relationships. He wants a joining. That word "join" means primarily "to glue or cement together," then, generally, "to unite, to join firmly." It is used in the passive voice signifying "to oneself join to, to be joined to". (Vine's Complete

Expository Dictionary).

Now we re-read the passage with our definition, "For his Spirit glues and cements and unites and joins firmly with our spirit to affirm that we are God's children." Any question or uncertainty as to what God's intention is has been blown out of the water! And it gets even better. God takes you out of the equation and makes the affirmation you needed to make for you. To AFFIRM means "intensive," and "to confirm, make sure", denotes "to assert strongly, affirm confidently". (Vines).

This union with Christ, this intense joining, cementing together, is where





you can live in the divine overflow of Christ. It is the Divinity (Christ) that is doing all the heavy lifting. Praise God! All of The Godhead is working on your behalf to join you into the family.

Jesus sacrificed His own body and affirms you into the family of God based on His efforts and not your own, and we are transformed into heirs of God's Glory!! God's plan is to catapult us into the glory realm of God. When we live our lives together with Christ, we are living un-

der the glory realm of Christ. I'm not talking about behavior modification. That's what the world does with its networks of psychiatrists and counselors. I'm talking about a spiritual transformation orchestrated by the Divinity of Christ. The only suffering that is involved in the process is NOT to let flesh get in the way and just trust and believe in the process.

At the last men's fellowship, Pastor shared a story about how he used to watch his mom can vegetables. He talked about how she was careful to make sure to fill those cans to the brim and how she would take a stick and slide it over the top of each jar. This was important in the sealing process. There could be no air in the jars; otherwise, the jars would not have an airtight seal and bacteria would grow inside the jar and then it would have to be thrown out. This was the way Pastor's mom trusted in the canning process; we need to trust in the processes of God. We have to trust Romans 8:16-17 and allow it to be the stick that keeps us level headed in these turbulent days. Jesus is coming, let's make Him proud!
